Services

Many people in the community have difficulty listening, understanding or speaking as well as reading and writing. Speech Pathologists also work with people who have difficulty eating and/or drinking. Ruth offers assessment and therapy for:

- Delayed & disordered speech development
- Delayed & disordered language development
- Early pre-reading & pre-spelling skills (phonological awareness)
- Stuttering
- Voice disorders
- Swallowing disorders
- Education and training sessions
- Communication & swallowing following neurological events (i.e. stroke, head injury)

Ruth is also a Registered Panel provider for families under the 'Better Start for Children with Disabilities' and 'Helping Children with Autism' initiatives.

How much therapy and how often it is needed varies with every person. The options available are discussed with you and you can decide the therapy goals (what you want to achieve) and the frequency of sessions depending on what you need and how often you need to attend.

Referral

Referral can be made by yourself, parents, teachers, GP, specialists, Paediatrician, or other health professionals.

Fees
